The program has been very successful and demonstrates how various parties can work together to support the education, development and growth of the next generation in their community.

We thank the Lord for the way he has given good gifts to the communities that CRWRF is involved in, and we pray that he may receive all the praise and glory through the work that we support!

Kenya

The Good Gift of Multiplying Support

The Education Bursary Fund (EBF) is focused on increasing access to secondary education for students who are vulnerable and poor. The recipients are chosen and supported by local committees that have been established at the four AICCAD-operated rescue centres that CRWRF supports.

Bilha is one of over 30 children currently supported by the EBF. Bilha, who lives with her elderly grandmother who cannot afford tuition fees, was selected for an EBF bursary by the local committee at the Mufu rescue home. Given her good academic performance, they helped her apply for a state funded scholarship. The EBF committee members liaise with the school on her behalf and provide emotional, social, and spiritual support in place of her parents, who ran away. With these supports in place, and because her school fees are paid, Bilha can focus on her academics.

The Fund enables AICCAD to ensure that children have access to education once they are re-integrated into their communities. The unique feature of the EBF being an endowment fund means that contributions are invested and only the interest earned is used to fund bursaries. The benefit for donors is that their gifts are multiplied to continue to support students every year. What a meaningful way to distribute gifts bestowed by God!




FAITHWORKS UPDATE

The Good Gift of Holistic Care

The New Hope Foundation continues to provide educational, nutritional, spiritual, and emotional care to the children within their community. In a country that suffers from ongoing poverty, this organization aims to support children through holistic care, with the mission of bringing hope to abandoned, orphaned, and vulnerable children.

Take Tommy, for example, a young man whose family could not afford to send him to high school. In the Lord's providence, and much to his and his parents' joy, he was connected to the home at New Hope and was able to move in last year to complete his

studies. When Tommy had to be rushed to a nearby clinic after falling unconscious during a friendly soccer match, it was discovered that he suffered from severe anemia. He received appropriate care and continues to have check-ups via the nurse who visits New Hope every week. This health care, combined with a hearty and nutritious meal plan at the orphanage, is allowing Tommy to regain his strength and energy, which will also benefit him in his studies. We thank the Lord for the work done at New Hope and pray that the Lord will continue to equip the staff so that they may continue providing holistic care to the children in their care.

India

The Good Gift of Daily Care and Stability



Over the last year, the churches in Manipur, India have experienced a rise in violent attacks due to ethnic clashes. These attacks have resulted in over 200 deaths and the burning of churches and homes. Community tension and the loss of income have also resulted in the lack of food supplies and the displacement of over 60,000 individuals living in that region.

CRWRF has partnered with a local church in Manipur providing food supplies and educational support to those who have fled from the violence and are now living in relief camps. As a result of the increased violence, several services – including schools – have closed, leaving many children unattended during the day and at risk of getting involved in the local clashes.

With our financial support, the churches have established Child Support Centres to provide care for those without daily supervision, continue to give study guidance to bridge the children's academic gaps, and provide spiritual and moral development from pastors and elders.

With the restriction of education, many teenagers living in relief camps have also been left without daily routine and risk being pulled into the ethnic clashes. Recognizing the need not only to give purpose to these young people's lives but also to provide training for them to find work and gain an income, the church further established a sewing school and a driving school. These skill training courses have provided stability and hope for many of these individuals while also sharing the light of the gospel in these times of conflict.

A few months later, they were able to distribute corn and powdered milk to 200 additional families in need.
